P Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.


Faithful God,



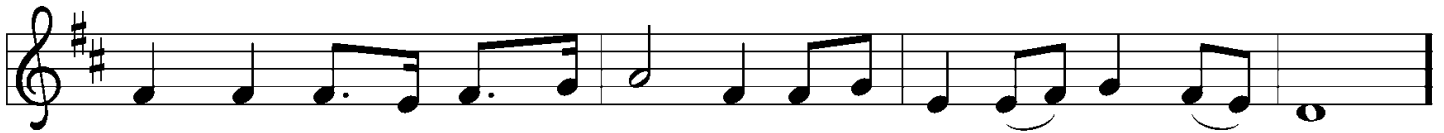

Parkside For Social Justice – definition and resource for October 2020:

Classism: any attitude or institutional practice which subordinates people of a certain socioeconomic class due to income, occupation, education, and/or their economic status; a system that works to keep certain communities within a set socioeconomic class and prevents social and economic mobility.

Mark Charles on TEDx Tysons

"We The People - the three most misunderstood words in US History"

It runs for 17:45 minutes.

It pushes more to rethinking the foundation of our country and why broad-based dialogs are important. If others would watch it and see what they think I would be grateful.

This video makes you rethink what the constitution was designed to do then, what it has meant for those that are marginalized, and a suggestion for moving forward. My thought was that it increases the understanding of "white privilege" as something institutional in the US. My hope in watching the video is that people will rethink how the native population was treated and is still treated. The video ends with a call to have diverse groups meet to work toward a shared vision for the future by looking back and understanding the shared past. There was a mention of the Iroquois tradition of remembering the past seven generations and to care for the future for the next seven generations. After watching the video my hope was we could ask people, "What could be the next step for us that builds common understanding" and "What would we like to see for the future seven generations hence"?
