



Children's Time

Psalm 22:23-31

All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD. (Ps. 22:27)

- P You who fear the LORD, give praise! All you of Jacob's line, give glory. Stand in awe of the LORD, all you offspring of Israel.
- C For the LORD does not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty; neither is the LORD's face hidden from them; but when they cry out, the LORD hears them.
- P From you comes my praise in the great assembly; I will perform my vows in the sight of those who fear the LORD.
- C The poor shall eat and be satisfied, Let those who seek the LORD give praise! May your hearts live forever!
- P All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD; all the families of nations shall bow before God.

Gospel: Mark 8:31-38

After Peter confesses his belief that Jesus is the Messiah, Jesus tells his disciples for the first time what is to come. Peter's response indicates that he does not yet understand the way of the cross that Jesus will travel.

[Jesus] began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things." He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this


adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

Amanda Gorman, the first youth poet laureate at age 22, became the youngest inaugural poet in memory reading her poem at President Biden's inauguration. Many have been inspired by her words and the message she shared with all of us. Ms. Gorman was quoted as saying her intention was "to not...in any way gloss over what we've seen over the past few weeks and, I dare say the past few years, but what I really aspire to do in the poem is to be able to use my words to envision a way in which our country can still come together and can still heal. It's doing that in a way that is not erasing or neglecting the harsh truths I think America needs to reconcile with".
