

Children's Time

Psalm 19

- P The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky proclaims its maker's handiwork.
- C One day tells its tale to another, and one night imparts knowledge to another.
- P Although they have no words or language, and their voices are not heard,
- C their sound has gone out into all lands, and their message to the ends of the world, where God has pitched a tent for the sun.
- P It comes forth like a bridegroom out of his chamber; it rejoices like a champion to run its course. It goes forth from the uttermost edge of the heavens and runs about to the end of it again; nothing is hidden from its burning heat. The teaching of the LORD is perfect and revives the soul; the testimony of the LORD is sure and gives wisdom to the simple.

- C The statutes of the LORD are just and rejoice the heart; the commandment of the LORD is clear and gives light to the eyes.
- P The fear of the LORD is clean and endures forever; the judgments of the LORD are true and righteous altogether.
- C More to be desired are they than gold, more than much fine gold, sweeter far than honey, than honey in the comb.
- P By them also is your servant enlightened, and in keeping them there is great reward.
- C Who can detect one's own offenses? Cleanse me from my secret faults.
- P Above all, keep your servant from presumptuous sins; let them not get dominion over me; then shall I be whole and sound, and innocent of a great offense.
- C Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O LORD, my strength and my redeemer.

Gospel: John 2:13-22

Jesus attacks the commercialization of religion by driving merchants out of the temple. When challenged, he responds mysteriously, with the first prediction of his own death and resurrection. In the midst of a seemingly stable religious center, Jesus suggests that the center itself has changed.

The Passover of the Jews was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and the money changers seated at their tables. Making a whip of cords, he drove all of them out of the temple, both the sheep and the cattle. He also poured out the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. He told those who were selling the doves, "Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!" His disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me." The Jews then said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews then said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking of the temple of his body. After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.



Parkside For Social Justice - March - What is the Pink Tax?

The pink tax refers to the extra amount of money women pay for specific products or services. Sometimes you'll see or hear it referred to as price discrimination or gender-pricing. A common example of the pink tax is the cheap razors for sale in most pharmacies and grocery stores. The "men's" version is blue and the "women's" version is pink.

That is the only difference, the color. But the women's version is inevitably more expensive than the men's. Products for women and girls cost 7% more than comparable products for men and boys.

- 7% more for toys and accessories
- 4% more for children's clothing
- · 8% more for adult clothing
- 13% more for personal care products

The Tampon Tax is one type of Pink Tax that involves taxation of feminine hygiene products. Some U.S. states exempted male-oriented hygiene products such as Rogaine (for hair loss) from state sales tax while not exempting feminine hygiene products.

In addition to contributing to Parkside's collection of feminine hygiene products during Lent there are other ways to help as well. Complain in writing to retailers, manufacturers, and service providers about pink tax markups. Make the decision to not pay more for products marketed to women and shop in the men's aisle. Finally, contact your local, state and federal officials to let them know that something needs to be done to end the Pink Tax.
