

- P The grace of our Lord, Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

- P Stir up the wills of your faithful people, Lord God, and open our ears to the preaching of John, that, rejoicing in your salvation, we may bring forth the fruits of repentance; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

First Reading: Micah 5:2-5a

The prophet Micah, having pronounced judgment upon Judah, speaks of a future shepherdking who, like David, will come from the small town of Bethlehem. (Ephrathah refers to the area around Bethlehem.) This king will restore Israel and bring peace. New Testament writers understood this passage to be referring to Jesus.

But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days. Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has brought forth; then the rest of his kindred shall return to the people of Israel. And he shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God. And they shall live secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth; and he shall be the one of peace.

Second Reading: Hebrews 10:5-10

Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)." When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings". Then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Gospel: Luke 1:39-45 [46-55]

Elizabeth, John's mother, and Mary, the mother of Jesus, are two women filled with the Holy Spirit and with faith. In Elizabeth's inspired greeting and Mary's song of praise we hear of a saving God who remembers, scatters, lifts up, and fulfills all things.

In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord." And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly: he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever."

Words of Institution

P In the night in which he was handed over, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

- C Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen

Holy Communion at St. Paul's: celebrated every time we gather, and is open to all.

Please approach by the center aisle, receive the bread, take the wine and return to your seat via the side aisle. *Or remain in your seat and use the elements you picked up on the way into church. Gluten-free wafers and grape juice are available. Simply request it from the assisting minister holding the wine. Children are welcome! Those who receive elsewhere may receive here. Children who do not yet receive may come for a blessing. If you have difficulty walking, communion will be brought to you at your seat.

- P Most High God, you have come among us at this table. By the Spirit's power, form us to be bearers of your word, sharing gifts of mercy and grace with all, through Christ Jesus, our host and our guest.
- C Amen.


Benediction

Tigers Den Food Pantry: The Food Pantry is open to anyone in need in zip code 14226 or by referral. The Pantry hours for December are: Thursdays 16th, 23rd and 30th from 3:00-6:30 pm, and Saturday 12/11 from 9:00 am-12:30 pm. The Pantry will be closed on Christmas Day, December 25th. Donations for December are juice, snacks such as pretzels, spaghetti-O's, and canned ravioli.

Daily Bread Food Truck: The Daily Bread Food Truck has moved onto their "give one" season and is parked in the St. Paul's driveway next to the flag pole each Monday giving hot meals out from 4:30-6:30 pm.

Starting Saturday December 11th (through the winter), we will also be giving meals on the Saturdays that the Tiger's Den Food Pantry is open from 9am–11:30am.

Christmas Eve Worship: St. Paul's will be offering 40 min abbreviated in-person worship services on Christmas Eve at 4pm and 7pm (which will be live-streaming to you-tube channel) AND WNY Church Unleashed will also be offering their service at 5 pm on MeTV.

Haiti: Due to the ongoing unrest and safety concerns in Haiti, we have not been able to send any mission teams to Ile A Vache, Haiti in over two years. We are hoping and planning to resume when it is safe to do so. In the meantime our hearts are heavy with a desire to help our Haitian friends. We want to remind you that Caribbean Children's Foundation is seeking donations for their ongoing work at Grace school and orphanage and you can donate to them at https:// www.caribbeanchildrensfoundation.org/donate. Closer to home, we are collecting donations for Vive shelter, a program of Jericho Road Community Health Program in Buffalo. According to a recent Buffalo news article people from Haiti and Colombia are among the largest groups of refugees seeking asylum in the US and Canada and being housed temporarily at the shelter on Wyoming Ave. Michelle Biegner is facilitating a collection of items on their wish list to assist with the influx of these families. Please consider making a donation of one of the following items between Thanksgiving and Christmas and they will be delivered to the shelter for use at the shelter.
