

Gospel: Luke 4:1-13

After being filled with the Holy Spirit at his baptism, Jesus is led in the wilderness. Through his responses to the temptations of the devil, he defines what it means to be called "the Son of God."

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become a loaf of bread." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone.'" Then the devil led him up and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And the devil said to him, "To you I will give their glory and all this authority; for it has been given over to me, and I give it to anyone I please. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him." Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, saying to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written, 'He will command his angels concerning you, to protect you,' and 'On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone.' "Jesus answered him, "It is said, 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.' " When the devil had finished every test, he departed from him until an opportune time.

First Communion/Communion Celebration 2022

Our recent tradition at Parkside has been to offer some family classes after worship and then celebrate on Palm Sunday. **Class is scheduled for April 3rd**, with Palm Sunday happening on April 10th.

Who is eligible for this class? Anyone! In recent years the church has practices what is called 'open' table. This means you don't have to be a member of Parkside - you don't even have to be Lutheran - ALL are welcomed. We also know Jesus was big on welcoming children. Pastor will serve anyone who comes up and sticks out a hand. These classes are an opportunity for those who still want to mark the occasion with a celebration. They are also an opportunity for the family to talk about faith/values/traditions. Each class is about an hour and we will have lunch together.

If you or a child in your life is interested in participating, please let Pastor know asap, so that we can have the right amount of food and supplies. The whole family does not have to attend but all are welcomed. We do ask that at least one adult attend. (Again, the hope being that these classes foster further conversation at home.)

Blessing Box – We need non-perishable foods for the Blessing Box. Especially welcome are "grab & go" nonperishable foods, especially those that withstand freezing temps. Drop off donations in the Narthex or put them directly in the box. Located on Depew side of building.

Ronald McDonald House - A congregation member's grandson is raising funds for the <u>Ronald</u> <u>McDonald House</u> by collecting pop can tabs. There is a small Ronald McDonald cardboard box in the Narthex where you can leave your pop can tabs. *Thank you!*

Diaper Collection - This Lent, Lutheran churches across Upstate New York are collecting Diapers. We hope to collectively collect 50,000 Diapers.

Why Diapers? Diapers are material basic necessities all children require, as essential as food, shelter, and clothing. Yet, most state and national safety-net programs do not recognize diapers as a basic need. *What is Diaper Need?* Diaper need is the lack of a sufficient amount of diapers to keep a baby clean, dry, and healthy. Babies require up to 12 diapers a day, toddlers about eight. Five Million babies and toddlers live in poor or low-income families.

On average Diapers cost between \$70 and \$80 dollars a month. There are zero federal programs that cover the cost of diapers. Check out Buffalo's Diaper Bank for more info: <u>https://www.everybottomcovered.org/</u>
