- P Alleluia! Christ is risen.
- C Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!
- P In the waters of baptism, we have passed over from death to life with Jesus Christ, and we are a new creation.
- C For this saving mystery, and for this water, let us bless God, our Risen Savior and Lord.

- P We thank you, God, for your river of life, flowing freely from your throne of mercy: through the earth, through the city, through Amherst, through every living thing. You rescued Noah and his family from the flood; You opened wide the sea for the Israelites. Now in these waters you flood us with mercy, and our sin is drowned forever. You open the gate of righteousness and we pass safely through.

- P The grace of our Lord, Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.
- C And also with you.

Children's Time

First Reading: Acts 5:27-32

Peter has been arrested for proclaiming the good news of Jesus' death and resurrection. His response to the charges of the high priest summarizes the early church's proclamation of forgiveness of sin through repentance.

When they had brought [the apostles,] they had them stand before the council. The high priest questioned them, saying, "We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you are determined to bring this man's blood on us." But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than any human authority. The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Savior that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him."

- C Thanks be to God.

Psalm 118:14-29 (read responsively)

You are my God, and I will exalt you. (Ps. 118:28)

- A The LORD is my strength and my song, and has become my salvation.
- C Shouts of rejoicing and salvation echo in the tents of the righteous: "The right hand of the LORD acts valiantly!
- A The right hand of the LORD is exalted! The right hand of the LORD acts valiantly!"
- C I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the LORD.
- A The LORD indeed punished me sorely, but did not hand me over to death.
- C Open for me the gates of righteousness; I will enter them and give thanks to the LORD.

- A "This is the gate of the LORD; here the righteous may enter."
- C I give thanks to you, for you have answered me and you have become my salvation.
- A The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone.
- C By the LORD has this been done; it is marvelous in our eyes.
- A This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.
- C Hosanna! O LORD, save us! We pray to you, LORD, prosper our days!
- A Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the LORD; we bless you from the house of the LORD.
- C The LORD is God and has given us light. Form a procession with branches up to the corners of the altar.
- A You are my God, and I will thank you; you are my God, and I will exalt you.
- C Give thanks to the LORD, for the LORD is good; God's mercy endures forever.
- A The Word of the Lord
- C Thanks be to God.
- P The Holy Gospel according to John the 20th Chapter.
- C Glory to you, O Lord.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

The unprecedented events of the day of resurrection continue as the risen Jesus appears to his fearful disciples. A week later, after Thomas worships Jesus, Jesus pronounces that the blessings of the resurrection are also for those who "have not seen and yet believe."


When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with


them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

A Protect those in Ukraine. We ask for your hand of protection to be with all of those affected by the war. Bring peace to our world and help us to be instruments to make that happen. Let light overcome the evil. Give leaders across the globe hearts of compassion, understanding and grace. Merciful God,

C hear our prayer.

A Uphold your children who cry out to you, especially the people on our Prayer List and those we name now either silently or aloud. Wherever people are overcome by the fear of death, breathe into them your life and peace. God, in your mercy,

C hear our prayer.

A Inspire those who lead your people in worship and praise. With joyful motion and sound, send us forth with praise that we cannot keep to ourselves. God, in your mercy,

- P Brothers and sisters in Christ: in Holy Baptism our Lord Jesus Christ received you and made you members of his Church. In the community of God's people, you have learned from his Word God's loving purpose for you and all creation. You have been nourished at his holy table and called to be witnesses to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. You have made public affirmation of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism:
 - to live among God's faithful people, to hear his Word and share in his supper,
 - to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
 - to serve all people, following the example of our Lord Jesus,
 - and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Response: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

Words of Institution

P In the night in which he was handed over, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.
