A message from Pastor Steve

Dear missionaries and friends of St. Paul's,

(This is going to be a bit longer than usual. Buckle up and keep your hands and feet inside the vehicle at all times!)

"Where would you rather be than right here, right now?" - Mary Levy

I was at the stadium a couple Mondays ago and Marv came out and led us in that "cheer." As a longtime Bills fan, it was an epic and sacred moment because things are amazing right now! So fun to be a part of this team as a fan.

But I believe Jesus would say the same things to St. Paul's!! What an incredible time in our 195-year history. We have thrived during the pandemic, shifted and expanded our focus and reach. People have returned to the mission site at 4007 Main to experience Jesus in person again. Worship attendance is thriving. New folks are showing up every single week. The make-up of the congregation is starting to reflect the community: multi-color, multi-gender, and multi-cultural. Sunday school, Youth Group and Confirmation are restarting and adapting to the new post-pandemic issues. Our food insecurity ministries are stronger and more diverse than ever.

Right here! Right now!

And so this new phase and increased ministry potential of St. Paul's will expand in three major ways over the next year: increased space/people; increased staff; renewed leadership.

First, increased space/people. Amherst Lutheran Church (5125 Main St - 2.2 miles away toward Williamsville) has asked to merge with St. Paul's. Their group of vision-oriented leaders want to make a shift in their ministry *before* it's too late and the congregation has moved into "church hospice" mode. This mode has happened to too many churches recently. So, this is a good, pro-active decision. 75% of Lutheran Churches in NY experience worship with less than 40 people per week. The Councils of both churches, along with consultation from Jeff Human (Synod and St. Paul's attorney specializing in church mergers), will be working hard over the next few weeks and months to bring this to fruition. It will allow St. Paul's to increase ministry space, active missionaries, and future financial assets to support growing staff needs and help our ministry to become wider and deeper. This will give St. Paul's a Saturday night worship service option at the Amherst Lutheran site with St. Paul's and other Lutheran Church staff leading the service.

There will be a few times to ask questions and share excitement about this venture. The first one will be this Sunday, October 2nd after church. Several Council members will join me in the sanctuary after church for an informal question and answer session after church. Our hope is that an official affirmation of the merger will take place at our Annual Meeting on December 4th after church. But there will be plenty more information before then.

Second, increased staff. This merger will help us increase our pastoral staff to meet our current and future needs. Here's the good news: we have a candidate already!! Instead of "trusting the process" of the church (which I no longer trust that much), we have a pastoral candidate in the works. This candidate is wonderfully gifted and moving into the area with her husband, who is awaiting a call from another local church. We will bring her in during the fall to meet with leadership and congregation, and be here on a Sunday to preach and lead worship as well. If all goes well with approval from Council, affirmation from the congregation and her husband also receiving a call, we hope to have her onboard to start the new year. She is a gift and will be a huge asset to St. Paul's. She will be a co-pastor with me to help lead St. Paul's into the next few years of our important ministry.

Third, renewal. St. Paul's has received a generous grant from the Lily Foundation for a *Congregational Renewal Grant*. These grants are awarded to churches who are doing dynamic ministry in the world and have had long term pastors that need renewal time so that they can come back for the important work ahead. That is exactly where St. Paul's is at! So our renewal time will take place from May 28-Sept 5, 2023. I will be away to rest, renew and reconnect with my family **SO THAT I** can return refreshed to the congregation to finish my career helping St. Paul's become one of the most dynamic, vibrant, and multi-cultural churches in our area. For that time period, I will be away for spiritual reflection, therapy, discernment, travel, play, and very important family time. At the same time, the congregation will have renewal opportunities with new voices preaching, exact fellowship events, new groups building new leaders, times for spiritual gift identification, and more. All of this with Pastor Kristen leading the charge!

The Council and I have been talking about this for four years now. But with the arrival of the pandemic, we tabled it so I could help lead the congregation through those unprecedented times. In those times, we discovered many new and creative ways to be church. However; as Michelle has rightly reminded me, once again my family got "the leftovers" of my energy, presence, and care. This renewal time will help me be healthier at home, healthier at work and healthier in general to lead St. Paul's for the reminder of my career.

Where would I rather be? Right here. And right now!

For these two churches to come together, merge resources and missionaries, increase our worship energy, reach, and space. For increasing our current staff with MORE gifted, spiritual leaders that I trust and love....for time away to recharge and renew....I can't imagine being anywhere else.

Please talk to me with questions, joys, and concerns. Any and all of them.

Together, God has called us to "reach beyond ourselves." Who knew how much fun that would be eh??


