A message from Pastor Kristen



Welcome to Lent. A season of 40 days modeled after Jesus' time in the wilderness. Often, we frame the time Jesus spent in the wilderness as difficult, scary, and full of temptations. But the wilderness doesn't have to be that way. It was, also, a time that Jesus spent in prayer; holding tight to the creator who promises to be with us. It was a time and a place that

launched his ministry, that helped him figure out his next steps. Where Jesus said "no" a lot, in order that he might say "yes" to God and to us.

As a church community we are going to be taking time these next few weeks to explore what we, as individuals and we as a church, can do less of and what we can do more of. We will have space to write those things down in the entryway of St. Paul's (SPEC) and ALC; and to share our journeys with one another.

One of the things we are going to say "yes" to together is prayer. We will name specific people in various aspects of our lives like elected leaders, our ministry partners, front line workers, service industry workers (like my favorite hair stylist!) and people in education. Each week you can add names to the board and we will pray for them during our worship services.

We will say "yes" to spending some time in God's word. You can do that through the devos that Mary Wolf has written for us, available in booklets or through our Facebook page. We will, also, do that during our Soup & Psalms gatherings on Wednesday afternoons. Ellen Davis writes in her book *Pain and Praise: The Psalms as Common Prayer* that "The Psalms give us words for all the moods in which we come before God: adoration, exultation, gratitude; but also rage, despair, fear". Come at noon for soup and conversation. We'll explore, read, pray, and wander through a Psalm together.

Let this season of Lent be for all of us missionaries at St. Paul's, a time of prayer and a time to say "yes" to things that matter to God, the one who says "yes" to us.

Beginning sometime in the spring, as part of this grant, we will start receiving deliveries of milk from local dairies which we will then be able to give to our pantry families. With the price of eggs and milk becoming more and more expensive, over the past several months we

purchased milk and eggs from local groceries to provide to our families. This was made possible through your generous monetary donations. Thank you so much!!

We, also, added three new families in February, and expect more will be added in March. We are very grateful you are part of the food ministry here at St. Paul's, and the help you provide to families suffering food insecurity.

We would like the kids to bring up some change for the children's sermon to get them involved in helping others!







Cultural Awareness Corner

March is Women's History Month. It is fitting and exciting that we at St. Paul's are celebrating Kristen Arends as our congregation's first called female pastor. We are blessed to have Pastor Kristen on board. Please take time to welcome and get to know Kristen and her family.

Did you know in 2020 the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) celebrated 50 years of women being ordained; 40 years of women of color being ordained and 10 years of ordaining LGBTQIA people? On this anniversary the ELCA came out with a statement saying, in part "We lament that women have been barred from serving and have been bullied, dismissed and excluded. We, also, celebrate the gifts and service that women have brought to our church and our world as pastors." The struggle of women in our culture, including in our church, is recognized fully by the ELCA. Our church is committed to systemic changes that foster abundant, flourishing life for all persons within both church and society.

Did you know the ELCA is led by a female bishop? In 2013, Elizabeth Eaton was elected as the first female presiding bishop of the ELCA. Ordained in 1981, she was re-elected in 2019 and remains our bishop today.

Book Club for Black History/Women's Month



Meet Sundays March 5, 12, 19, 26 and April 2 at 9am - 9:45am.

Selections from the complete collection of Zora Neale Hurston's short stories *Hitting a Straight Lick with a Crooked Stick* by Zora Neale Hurston edited by Genevieve West, Amistad (HarperCollins) 2020.

We will read one story per week and talk about whether we liked it or not, how it makes us feel, black/white relationships in the stories and anything

else the story makes you want to talk about. No lectures, no analysis. This format allows participants to pick and choose which Sundays they wish to attend the group.

If you are interested in background material on Zora Neale Hurston, there is a little bit of it in the introduction in this collection. Feel free to bring that up for discussion, too, if it interests you. Hurston was a significant figure in the Harlem Renaissance. She was also part of the Great Migration. The short stories were written between 1921 and 1938.We will be reading stories chronologically from throughout that period.

St. Paul's was able to get 12 copies of the book from the Buffalo Public Library. The church will, also, have some copies available for a purchase price of \$15.00.
