A note from the Parish Council

Unfortunately, all good things must come to an end and that includes the summer break for Council. Although not meeting formally, the Council has continued to work over the summer by supporting both ongoing and new projects. The former includes the building renovations at the Amherst Lutheran campus, updating the technical infrastructure of the church office and routine maintenance of the St. Paul's campus building including the Olin House. In addition, the Council has approved improvements to the St. Paul's campus kitchen in conjunction with the Daily Bread Food Truck. These improvements will not only secure and support our current tenants, but also position us for potential new revenue from kitchen rentals.

I would also like to acknowledge all the support teams at St. Paul's. The Leadership Action Team (LAT) has been active all summer supervising and coordinating the work at the Amherst Lutheran campus. Jeff Stein, our facility manager, has been overseeing projects at both campuses. Bill Niblock, Leslie Boynton and Jeff Human have been working through the remaining details surrounding the ALC-STP merger.

Obviously, this short list doesn't cover all the contributions of our members. But as we await the return of Pastor Steve Biegner, I would like to specifically recognize the outstanding job Pastor Kristen Arends has done for us this summer. Given all the moving parts at St. Paul's, I think even a veteran pastor would be somewhat intimidated. Pastor Kristen has stepped up in every way to fill some very large shoes. I believe this experience will serve her well as she grows in her career and on behalf of the Council, am very glad she was here to carry us through in Pastor Steve's absence. Our Food Ministries: Daily Bread Food Truck



As summer draws to a close and we look forward to another *Daily Bread Food Truck* season, it is important for me to review the events of the past several months.

On the positive side, the kitchen received two new coats of paint, a new seamless vinyl floor, and the removal of the old range and convection oven. We purchased a new range (courtesy of a grant from FeedMore), a new convection oven and a new three-bay sink. Life was good!

Then St. Paul's was notified that in order to retain our current tenants (**Amherst Support Staff** and **Summit**, etc.) we needed a current Certificate of Occupancy to be issued by the Town of Amherst. This required several issues throughout the St. Paul's Campus to be brought up to current code. The most significant issue was the Commercial Kitchen which is required to upgrade the hood over the range and oven, installation of a fire suppression system, and relocation of the outside fan.

The majority of the summer was spent meeting with vendors who could provide the proper hood and fire suppression system, the Amherst Fire Marshall who provided guidance as to what was required to pass inspection, and meeting with an electrician, plumber, and roofer whose expertise is required for installation.

Once we received all of the financial proposals from the various vendors and tradesmen, a request was made to the WNY Impact Foundation and St. Paul's for funding. The Foundation, Finance Committee and Church Council approved the funding and a contract with the vendor was recently signed.

The timeframe to complete this project prior to our scheduled start date of October 16 for Monday Meal Share is very tight. Anyone who has been involved in a remodeling project knows that things don't always go as planned. Patience and flexibility will be required of all of us.

Most of all - *Thank you to* all who volunteered this summer to improve the kitchen. *Thank you to* the Foundation Finance Committee, Church Council and Pastor Kristen for their commitment to this *Daily Bread Food Truck* Mission project.

Thank you to Pastor Steve – although he was not involved this summer, his vision and guidance laid a firm foundation for our mission.

And a very special thanks to Jeff Stein who spent many hours working through this process with me. I could not have done it without his help and knowledge. ~ Leslie

Tiger's Den Food Pantry



This is the time of year when we at Tiger's Den want to express our thankfulness and gratitude to many people and organizations:






