A message from Pastor Steve

Dear friends and missionaries at St. Paul's,

31 - On January 21st, we had 31 different people/groups/homes/phones live streaming the 10am worship service. One of those was our 20 folks at the LCLC Winter Retreat. Another was a family of seven who had a sick child at home. One was in the Chicago area. At least one was in Florida. In fact, we may have had more people live streaming than in person!

Oh how Covid has changed us. Many ways tragically.... but a few of them for the good! Like this news from that Sunday.

We've starting doing "Sermons in a Minute" (retelling a whole sermon in just one minute and no I'm not going to start doing that on Sunday mornings, except maybe for home Bills games) through Church Unleashed and the social media savvy people on our team shared them on Facebook, TikTok and other platforms. In just the first two sermons alone, 367 new people visited the YouTube page and watched a worship service for the first time.

Digital Worship, Evangelism and Fellowship are here to stay. And they are reaching people!

That's why I wanted to share some exciting news with you. Due to some of the unique ministry options that St. Paul's is a part of, especially due to the gifts of our digital minister Andrew, we have been invited to be part of a new venture called The Narthex! This two-year project is a grant funded by the Lily Foundation. It will involve six congregations at first and then add 24 more in the second year. We shall come together to enhance congregational potential to reach people that would never darken the door of a brick and mortar church, as we share the good news of Jesus Christ. We will have a full evaluation of current ministry offerings and suggestions for additional ones with help from a consulting crew called The Unstuck Group. All the while, the original six churches will be sharing ideas and learning from one another.

I am looking for two or three people that would be passionate and excited about this venture to join us as a Digital Ministry Team for the year to work with The Unstuck Group. Please talk to Pastor Kristen, Andrew or me if you have interest.

Twenty six years ago, I started writing "ps from ps" devotions on this brand new platform called: e-mail. It went out to 17 people that were bold enough to get their own AOL address on this thing that Al Gore created called: the world wide web. And now look where we are??






