


Confession and Forgiveness

First Reading: Galatians 5:1, 13-25

For Paul, the freedom Christ gives is not permission to do whatever we want. It is the invitation to be what we could not be otherwise. The power and guidance of Christ's Holy Spirit produce a different kind of life, one marked by the fruit of this Holy Spirit.

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another.


Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

Gospel: Luke 9:51-62

Jesus is unwavering in his commitment to his mission in Jerusalem and will not be swayed by pettiness. In a series of striking cases in point, he calls his disciples to a similar single-mindedness.


When the days drew near for [Jesus] to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. And he sent messengers ahead of him. On their way they entered a village of the Samaritans to make ready for him; but they did not receive him, because his face was set toward Jerusalem. When his disciples James and John saw it, they said, "Lord, do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?" But he turned and rebuked them. Then they went on to another village.



- C Amen.





UPDATE ON THE CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

ON JUNE 22, 2025

At the meeting Sunday morning, both Motions passed. St. Paul's will move in the weeks and months ahead to (a) look to sell the Amherst Campus property and (b) begin an expansion project for increased space to battle food insecurity and build relationships in the Eggertsville neighborhood.

We are so thankful for all those who came out the meeting and listening sessions. We know that there is great excitement and deep grief surrounding these moves. We've heard your concerns and the Council and staff will be keeping what we've learned in mind as we move forward.

While there will be some work beginning over the summer on the Columbarium plans and design phase of the new project, most of the work and more updates will come in the fall. Until then, everything at the Amherst Campus will remain as is and we look forward to continuing to worship together on Saturday nights.

Here are a couple architectural renderings of the potential new space that we forgot to share at the meeting on Sunday. They are draft images and a Building Team will soon be established to firm up plans that will help St. Paul's fulfill the mission to reach beyond ourselves with the good news of Jesus Christ.

The congregation will be meeting in the future again to (a) approve the final price and purchaser of the Amherst Campus property and (b) approve the final plans for the Eggertsville expansion.
