Pastor's Annual Report for 2025

(Context - given during the meeting where we vote on selling the Amherst Campus and adding space to Eggertsville Campus)

SB: And time for us to reflect on and report about another year of ministry at St. Paul's.

SB: Absolutely. As a huge history buff, I'm super excited for the 200th Anny coming up.

KK: That celebration is going to remind us a lot of why God placed St. Paul's here and why God still needs us here.

KK: Absolutely, and our digital ministry continues to grow and share that message as well. The addition of "God on the Go" and our weekly digital content has made sharing God's love online even easier.



Update On The Congregational Meeting



UPDATE ON THE CONGREGATIONAL MEETING ON JUNE 22, 2025

At the meeting Sunday morning, both Motions passed. St. Paul's will move in the weeks and months ahead to (a) look to sell the Amherst Campus property and (b) begin an expansion project for increased space to battle food insecurity and build relationships in the Eggertsville neighborhood.

We are so thankful for all those who came out the meeting and listening sessions. We know that there is great excitement and deep grief surrounding these moves. We've heard your concerns and the Council and staff will be keeping what we've learned in mind as we move forward.

While there will be some work beginning over the summer on the Columbarium plans and design phase of the new project, most of the work and more updates will come in the fall. Until then, everything at the Amherst Campus will remain as is and we look forward to continuing to worship together on Saturday nights.

Here are a couple architectural renderings of the potential new space that we forgot to share at the meeting on Sunday. They are draft images and a Building Team will soon be established to firm up plans that will help St. Paul's fulfill the mission to reach beyond ourselves with the good news of Jesus Christ.

The congregation will be meeting in the future again to (a) approve the final price and purchaser of the Amherst Campus property and (b) approve the final plans for the Eggertsville expansion.

WHAT IS WIH?

WAITING IN HOPE MINISTRIES (WIH) is a national non-profit support ministry that exists to encourage, support and embrace those struggling through the grief of difficulty conceiving, known as infertility, miscarriage, adoption, and waiting through the process. We support, encourage, equip and point women and couples to the only hope of Jesus within their waiting and struggle to conceive or grow their family.

There are a total of six curriculums, with the first starting in June 2025. The first curriculum is "The Guide to Waiting in Hope", which is a six-session study. Feel free to join at any point! It is not required to attend every session.

WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE FIRST CURRICULUM?

We focus on the question "How do you wait in hope during infertility and pain?". Relevant topics include myths, relationships and marriage, personal reflection, group notes, and resources to help further the healing process. This is an open support group with anonymity. We want you to feel safe, trusted, and not alone. This is for YOU. So come comfy with a blanket, drink and snacks, or whatever else you'd like!
