A Pastoral Message from Steve

Dear Missionaries and Friend of St. Paul's,

This is an incredible, Pentecost-like time to be the church. The good news of Jesus love is needed in the community NOW more than ever. The Holy Spirit is active and the mission field is ripe. The question is, are we willing to step a little farther out of our comfort zone and traditions to see if we can reach more deeply into the community and the lives of so many in need?

St. Paul's has continued to do that in the 198-year storied history of this church. Over this time, St. Paul's: launched a church on Main Street so that it could reach two different ethnic communities to the north and south; battled through fires and setbacks but always rebuilt; took the risk multiple times to reach college students with spiritual support; helped launch Grace Ministries in Haiti with a school, church and medical clinic; partnered with the school district to open a food pantry; bought a food truck to battle food insecurity even more. And the list goes on!

So now we add to the list! We look to add space to our Eggertsville campus that will reach people with more food security opportunities in a space for those that aren't comfortable in a tradition church.

The Council will be proposing these two motions for our June 22nd meeting:

Motion 1:

Resolved, that St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church sell the Amherst Campus property, in recognition of increasing administrative and financial burdens, in order to focus and strengthen our ministry presence and mission in the Eggertsville community.

Motion 2:

Resolved, that the net proceeds from the sale of the Amherst Campus be designated for the expansion of the Eggertsville Campus, specifically for the construction of a coffee house and gathering area to support the Daily Bread food ministry and enhance our capacity for community outreach and relationship-building.

We will have time to talk and pray through these steps together. You are invited to be a part of the discussion times: June 8th at 11am after worship in Eggertsville; June 10th at 6:30pm-7:30pm at Eggertsville; June 21st at 5:45pm after worship at Amherst.

A Pastoral Message from Steve (continued)

More information will also be coming out multiple times via email in a “Did You Know?” format. We hope these bullets will answer many of your questions. If you have a question you’d like addressed, please email one of the pastoral staff or Council President.

The Lead Action Team, Council and staff have been working on this exciting step for many months and are looking forward to sharing more information as June rolls on.

At this point, we ask you to pray for this endeavor and its potential to reach people that would never darken the door of a traditional church with the good news of Jesus. Our calling is to “*reach beyond ourselves*” and this just may be a way for the oldest Lutheran church around to launch one of the newest and most exciting ventures for God’s mission.

If you need to drop off donations outside of pantry hours or office hours, please feel free to use the "wooden house" situated outside the pantry door.



WAITING *in* HOPE INFERTILITY SUPPORT MINISTRIES

WHAT IS WIH?

WAITING IN HOPE MINISTRIES (WIH) is a national non-profit support ministry that exists to encourage, support and embrace those struggling through the grief of difficulty conceiving, known as infertility, miscarriage, adoption, and waiting through the process. We support, encourage, equip and point women and couples to the only hope of Jesus within their waiting and struggle to conceive or grow their family.

There are a total of six curriculums, with the first starting in June 2025. The first curriculum is “The Guide to Waiting in Hope”, which is a six-session study. Feel free to join at any point! It is not required to attend every session.

We want you to feel safe, trusted, and not alone. This is for YOU. So come comfy with a blanket, drink and snacks, or whatever else you’d like!
