Summer Greetings to St. Paul's (Pastoral Message)

Many of you were in church July 7th and really enjoyed our Christmas in July service where we helped out the school and Tiger's Den with summer gifts and proclaimed that Jesus is not just born one day, but every day in our lives because of the first Christmas. We recognize God's "incarnation" every time we gather for worship, share Holy Communion, pray our way through trauma and tragedies, seeing the Holy Spirit guide us.

And some of you may have noticed my beloved Pops (who I labeled The Grinch that day in the sermon) protesting that we were doing this because it wasn't Christmas. Well, despite him being my "straight man" during the sermons sometimes, he actually does have some personal and theological thoughts on why he feels strongly about this, so I asked him to share them.

Dialog is good. Even when I'm right and he's wrong. Lol. Kidding. Dialog brings learning; learning brings depth; depth brings strength; strength brings the ability to share more with the world around us.

So here are his thoughts. Enjoy.

Chick Biegner says "NO" To Christmas in July

Knowing my displeasure of celebrating "Christmas in July" at the worship service on July 7^{th} , Steve invited me to express my opinion in this month's <u>Messenger.</u> I am, therefore, taking this opportunity to do so.

First of all, we all agree that no one knows the date of Jesus' birth.

It was almost certainly not December 25^{th} as the shepherds were out in countryside with their sheep, which is unlikely at that time of the year. But the early Church Fathers

realized this was a safe and smart

time to publicly celebrate the important truth of the Incarnation – that God Almighty broke into our human existence with the birth of Jesus –

when the emperor's soldiers were "hung over" or still celebrating the winter solstice. This December 25th date quickly spread over the entire Western Church. (The Eastern Orthodox celebrate on January 6th)

Summer Greeting/Pastoral Message Continued

So what's the big deal?

First of all, there is beauty and meaning in knowing that when we gather at St. Paul's Church each week, are gathered around the same scripture theme and liturgy as are millions of Christians (not just Lutherans) in One, holy, catholic (that is universal) Church.

Secondly, the Church Year is an important tool of the church to protect congregations by giving them a "balanced diet", in which we get to cover ALL of the events of our Lord's life and His teachings and not just the personal "favorites" of the local worship leader. Certainly this is not the case at St. Paul's, but I prefer to celebrate the Christmas season after the season of preparation (Advent) and before we focus on the mission of the church to proclaim God's love revealed in Jesus born of Mary to the whole world (Epiphany).

Food Ministries: Tiger's Den Food Pantry



We would like to thank everyone who participated in the "Christmas in July" tree. Your generosity amounted to \$675.00 in Tops gift cards for the pantry to use to help our families keep food on their tables. Thank you!

Questions have recently been asked concerning the vetting process for people in need who come to the pantry. Because we are part of FeedMore WNY, we are required to abide by the regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the New York State's Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP). There are three steps we require:

Before a person/family can receive assistance from Tiger's Den, they must prove their income falls within the USDA guidelines (income guidelines are available on the USDA website and Tiger's Den website). They must provide proof of income (tax return) or proof they already participate in one of the following programs: SNAP, WIC, TANF, Medicaid, or SSI.

Proof the person/family resides within zip code 14226: this is usually a utility bill. Proof of the number of family members: as claimed on their tax return, or claimed to be eligible for SNAP, WIC, TANF, Medicaid, or SSI.

Once the above requirements have been met, the person/head of household is asked to attest that all the information they provided is correct and sign the TEFAP Attestation of Eligibility form.

Food Ministries: Tiger's Den Food Pantry (cont'd.)

Because we are a FeedMore recipient agency, we are also required to assist any person/ family in need who resides outside our zip code once. We provide these individuals with needed essentials and then refer them to the FeedMore website to identify pantries within their own zip code.

We are concerned about the rising food insecurity issues in our zip code, and we are also aware of our responsibility to be good stewards of the donations we receive. After being in existence for eight years, Tiger's Den seems to be doing a pretty good job!!

In this seven-session study on 1 Samuel, Hannah's story of infertility, waiting and pain is similar to our story. This study focuses up to verse 18, where a heart change occurs even before the answer comes. Hannah's heart teaches us a lot about our own heart and pitfalls and guides us to be better from the pain.

This is an open support group with anonymity. We want you to feel safe, trusted, and not alone. This is for YOU. So come comfy with a blanket, drink and snacks, or whatever else you'd like!





Intern Accomplishments: Kaci Gottler

WNY Impact Foundation

This summary highlights the significant contributions and accomplishments of Kaci Gottler during her internship with the WNY Impact Foundation, focusing on her pivotal role in enhancing the digital presence and engagement for both the WNY Impact Foundation and the Daily Bread Food Truck (DBFT) initiative.

WNY Impact Foundation Digital Presence

Kaci's efforts significantly boosted the WNY IF website's visibility and engagement.

- **Website Visits:** The WNYIF website saw **231 visits** in the last 30 days, with a notable increase of **39 visits** in the last 7 days of July.
- **Conversations:** The website generated **4 conversations** recently, contributing to an average of **3-4 conversations** per month.

Daily Bread Food Truck (DBFT) Digital Presence

Kaci played a crucial role in the launch and promotion of the new Daily Bread Food Truck (DBFT) website and its social media channels.

- **Website Visits:** The DBFT website accumulated **186 visits** within the last 30 days, including **31 visits** in the last 7 days.
- **Social Views:** DBFT's social media content garnered **8,688 views** overall in the last 30 days.brand awareness and community interaction, including work related to the Give 716 initiative.

DBFT Social Media Engagement

Kaci's strategic management of DBFT's social media accounts significantly boosted brand awareness and community interaction, including work related to the Give 716 initiative.

Instagram

- **Followers:** The DBFT Instagram account gained **716 followers**, a figure notably associated with the "Give 716" initiative.
- **Total Views:** Content generated **7,017 views**, with **92.7%** from non-followers, indicating strong outreach.
 - **Top Performing Content:** The "hourly schedule" post achieved **2,400 views**, and the "Josh Allen signed jersey" content received **1,800 views**.

Facebook (June 30 - July 27)

- **Views:** The DBFT Facebook page saw a remarkable **19,355 views** in less than a month (June 30th July 27th), representing a substantial **+220.9%** increase.
- **Audience Breakdown: 64%** of views came from non-followers, highlighting effective content sharing.
 - **Top Performing Content:** The "matching post" was the most viewed with **3,449 views**, closely followed by the "Josh Allen jersey giveaway" (an initiative developed by Kaci) with **2,549 views**.
