In October, we welcomed 12 new families to Tiger's Den, and provided 75 families with much needed food, personal care items, and paper products. We expect our numbers to continue to increase as changes in the SNAP program begin to impact more families in our area. Inflation impacts everyone, so if you are aware of someone in our area (14226) who may be experiencing food insecurity, please let them know Tiger's Den Food Pantry is here to help them through this challenging time.

The hours for November are: Thursdays 11/6 and 11/20 from 3:00-6:30 pm, Saturdays 11/8 and 11/22 from 9:00 am-12:30 pm; and we have added an additional date on Wednesday, 11/26 from 3:00-6:00 pm.

WAITING IN HOPE MINISTRIES (WIH) is a national non-profit support ministry that exists to encourage, support and embrace those struggling through the grief of difficulty conceiving, known as infertility, miscarriage, adoption, and waiting through the process. We support, encourage, equip and point women and couples to the only hope of Jesus within their waiting and struggle to conceive or grow their family.

The second curriculum begins in September and is "The Heart of Hannah", which is a seven-session study. Feel free to join at any point! It is not required to attend every session.

WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE SECOND CURRICULUM?

In this seven-session study on 1 Samuel, Hannah's story of infertility, waiting and pain is similar to our story. This study focuses up to verse 18, where a heart change occurs even before the answer comes. Hannah's heart teaches us a lot about our own heart and pitfalls and guides us to be better from the pain.

This is an open support group with anonymity. We want you to feel safe, trusted, and not alone. This is for YOU. So come comfy with a blanket, drink and snacks, or whatever else you'd like!




Next Meeting: Wednesday, Nov. 19 at 12:00 noon St. Paul's Gathering Space.

Finance Committee Update

Finance Committee Update: October 5th, 2025.

On Sunday October 5th, the finance team provided a brief update for the congregation, and we wanted to follow that up with a quick note for those who were not present for worship. One of the roles of the Finance Committee is to keep the congregation informed on the financial performance of St. Paul's. We are coming off the summer months, where service offerings historically tend to be down, with folks out of town and engaging in summer activities. Typically, in September we see a rebound in service offerings, as we head into the fourth quarter. This past summer we did see a lower level of service offerings over the June – August timeframe, \$10K below the summer of 2024. Additionally last month, we were \$6K below September '24 service offerings. So, where this lands us as we head into the fourth quarter, is that YTD Service offerings are running behind last year. The church is approximately \$26K or 13% below our September YTD budgeted figure. That said, church leadership continues to do an outstanding job of managing expenses, which are below budget despite some elevation in utility expenses and bathroom repairs. However, with the revenue short fall we are running a deficit year to date.

So, at this point the "alarm bells" for the Finance Committee are not going off, but we felt that it was prudent to create awareness with the congregation. The church does remain in a strong financial position, but the Finance Committee does feel that it is important that our recurring revenues cover our recurring expenses. At a recent meeting we compared it to how we each manage our personal financial situation – Your paycheck/monthly income should be sufficient to cover your monthly expenses.

All of that said, this church supports a multitude of ministry activities and Steve and Kristen do a fantastic job of highlighting these each week before the offering. The impact we collectively are making for people in need is real and would not be possible without your Time, Talents and Treasures.... So, a big thank you!!! For St. Paul's to continue to be effective with our ministry outreach, we need the "infrastructure" – the physical building, the people, and the platform – which are directly supported by your service offerings.

So again, the finance team wanted to create some awareness of where we stand year to date, as we head into the fourth quarter. As we ramp up our annual Stewardship campaign over the next month, we will have some additional updates.

Wheels for Workers continues to have an outstanding year fulfilling its mission of donating bikes to those in need in WNY! To date we have donated over **1,400 bikes!** These bikes are not only helping our community, but every bike we give a new life to stays out of the landfill.

We continue to increase the number of community partners we work with. These partners are critical to our success because they ensure our bikes get into the hands of their clients providing us access to communities we wouldn't be able to reach otherwise. In September and October alone we delivered bikes to the Buffalo Academy of Science Charter School, Buffalo Myanmar Association, East Side Bike Club, Firehouse Church, Jami Masjid Buffalo Mosque, Journeys End, Karen Society of Buffalo and Response to Love.

Wheels for Workers also fixed 59 students bikes at three University of Buffalo campuses.




Thank you to St. Paul's
